

## Petition Circulation Instructions

1. The petition circulator is defined as the person that is qualified to register to vote in Arizona is requesting other registered voters in Arizona to sign the petition.
2. Circulators DO NOT sign the back of the petition form until in the presence of a notary.
3. Be sure to place a check mark in the appropriate space on the upper right hand corner for volunteer or paid circulator.
4. Circulators can be a signer on the front of the petition. However, like all signers they can sign a petition only once.
5. Signers of the petition must do so in the presence of the circulator.
6. Signers of the petition can be registered to any party in Arizona.
7. Signers must use the same name and address they used when last registered to vote.
8. The petition form must contain signers all from the same county. If a signer is from another county have them sign another form. Keep the county forms separate. When the petition is filed with the Secretary of State the forms will be sorted by the county and sent to the county with the most signatures represented on the form. The county recorder will verify the registration information. For example if most of the signers on the petition form are from Maricopa County and a few are from Pinal County the form will only be sent to Maricopa County and the Pinal County signatures will not be counted.
9. Petition forms can contain one signer but no more than fifteen. If you run out of signature space, get another form. If someone made an error and crossed out a line and then signs on the next line below that form will only have a maximum of fourteen signatures.
10. Do not write on the margins of the petition form or anywhere on the back except in the spaces and blanks provided. If you wish to identify the forms by county, do so on your clipboard or on the table top where the petition form is located but not on the form itself.
11. About the column headings, stress to the signer the importance of filling out the form as it appears on the county registrar's rolls. In almost all cases, signers will have a residence address house number to put in the appropriate place, no P.O. boxes are allowed. If the individual does not have a house number, then the directions on how to get to the dwelling may be provided in the address column. In almost all cases a standard zip code will go in the zip code column. The Post Office address is used in the event there is no street or house number associated with the signer's dwelling.
12. Circulators must sign the back of the form **in the presence** of a notary before the form is notarized. Notaries can be found at your nearby bank, title company, insurance office, or public office.
13. Once the back of the petition has been signed by the circulator and notarized, mail the form to Recall John McCain Committee P.O. Box 21536 Mesa, AZ 85277-1638.
